This weekend, three Kirkland parks will be teeming with softball players and fans out to support a West Island institution, the 23rd annual Sian Bradwell Softball Tournament.

Some 17 teams have signed up for this year's edition of the four-day tournament, a friendly event for adult athletes that gets underway at 7 p.m. Thursday evening at Meades, Holleuffer and Parc des Bénévoles.

The softball tournament is just one of the fun-filled events that takes place throughout the year in support of the Sian Bradwell Fund, a fund that raises money to purchase medical equipment for the diagnosis and treatment of children with cancer.

Little Sian Bradwell passed away at the age of 17 months in 1986. The Sian Bradwell Fund was established in 1990 by Ken and Sharon Bradwell, the toddler's parents, in an attempt to turn their heartache into something positive.

Over the years, the fund has raised more than \$961,000 for the Montreal Children's Hospital and Toronto's Sick Kids Hospital. This year it is within striking distance of the One Million mark.

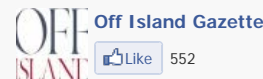
