Nine hospitals across Canada, including McMaster Children's Hospital, will be holding a virtual walk in an effort to raise awareness and funds for childhood cancers.

Step-by-Step-Tembre is a family-friendly virtual walk that runs between Sept. 1 and 30 and will, locally, raise funds for the pediatric oncology program at

McMaster Children's Hospital.

Participants are invited to walk, run, stroll, skate, even use the treadmill. You can put a team together or participate on your own.

The initiative is a reminder that September is usually a time when children go back to school, refreshed from the summer holidays. But for children battling cancer, September is another month of treatment and hospital visits and prolonged isolation.
