

ABOUT KEN

Ken was born in Ashton-under-Lyne, Manchester (Lancashire, England) on June 3rd, 1952. He finished school at the age of 16, and started working for the largest meatpacking firm in England: Walls Meats. Within a year, he became supervisor of a 4-team sales unit which had the top sales in the area. At night, he took courses at the Tameside Institute of Technology, where he earned a diploma in supervisory management studies. He later became a cost accountant at the Sir Richard Arkwright textile company in Portiswood (Stockport, Cheshire).

Ken was a cross-country runner, a strong swimmer and played football (soccer) from the time he started walking — an activity in which he was involved all his life as a player and coach. Ken was a loyal supporter of Manchester United Football Club, but it was the Manchester City Football Club which sent scouts to watch the young player when his skill drew their attention.





Ken emigrated to Canada in 1975, and worked in the Investments department of the Bank of Nova Scotia in Toronto. While playing for the bank's soccer team against the Royal Bank of Canada in 1976, he met Sharon, a football fan who worked at RBC and was the secretary of the RBC soccer team in Montreal. They were married in 1979. Their daughter Sîan was born in 1984.

After Sîan's death at the age of 17 months in 1986 as a result of cancer (primitive neuroectodermal tumour), Ken founded the <u>Sîan Bradwell Fund For Children With Cancer</u> as a way of keeping Sîan's name alive and helping other young cancer patients. Over \$1,800,000 has been donated in Sîan's name.



Ken and his friend Bobby Baylis, a former player with the Olympique de Montreal team of the North American Soccer League, coached the Dorval (Quebec) inter-city team. After receiving his coaching certification, Ken also



While living in Montreal, Ken worked as an accountant and in the evenings, studied Accountancy at McGill University. He was a long-time volunteer for the West Island Volunteer Bureau, and played for Midland Ross, Rolls Royce, Pointe-Claire Reds, Pointe-Claire Wanderers, Greendale, and Kirkland United soccer teams until 1997, when work-related transfers brought Ken and Sharon to Ontario.



Ken joined the Burlington Soccer League and played for the Panthers and Wanderers Football Club until 2006, when injuries and a heart attack ended his playing career. Already a convenor, he became the full-time coach of the Wanderers F.C. team and remained so until the end of the 2015 season.













The Wanderers were League and Playoff Champions in 2015, but by the time the 2016 season opened, Ken was too ill with cardiac-related issues to do anything more than watch one or two games.

His brave journey ended on July 14th, 2016.

In Ken's honour, endowments have been set up at the three main hospitals where he was treated: Joseph Brant Hospital (JBH) in Burlington, Oakville Trafalgar Memorial Hospital (OTMH) in Oakville, and the Juravinski Cancer Centre (JCC) in Hamilton. 2015 – Rob Dean (captain)

Meritorious Service Medal (**Governor General of Canada**)





After 30 years of working as a volunteer for the hospitals, Ken was awarded the Meritorious Service medal for establishing a **Sian Bradwell Endowment for children** with cancer at the Montreal Children's Hospital, Sick Kids Hospital in Toronto and McMaster Children's Hospital in Hamilton. Each foundation contributes towards purchasing priority medical equipment for the Oncology department.
