Started in 1986 and established formally in 1990 in remembrance of Sîan who lost her battle with cancer at the age of 17 months.

Sân Anela Marisa Bradwell was born on October 3rd, 1984 at St. Mary's Hospital in Montreal.

Sŷan (pronounced "SHAHN", hers is a Welsh Gaelic name) was diagnosed on May 1st, 1985 as having a rare form of cancer called 'primitive neuroectodermal tumour' in her liver, spine and foot.

Doctors thought the cancer had started in her pancreas and spread through her bloodstream. The first visible sign was a lump on her foot, which had appeared literally overnight.

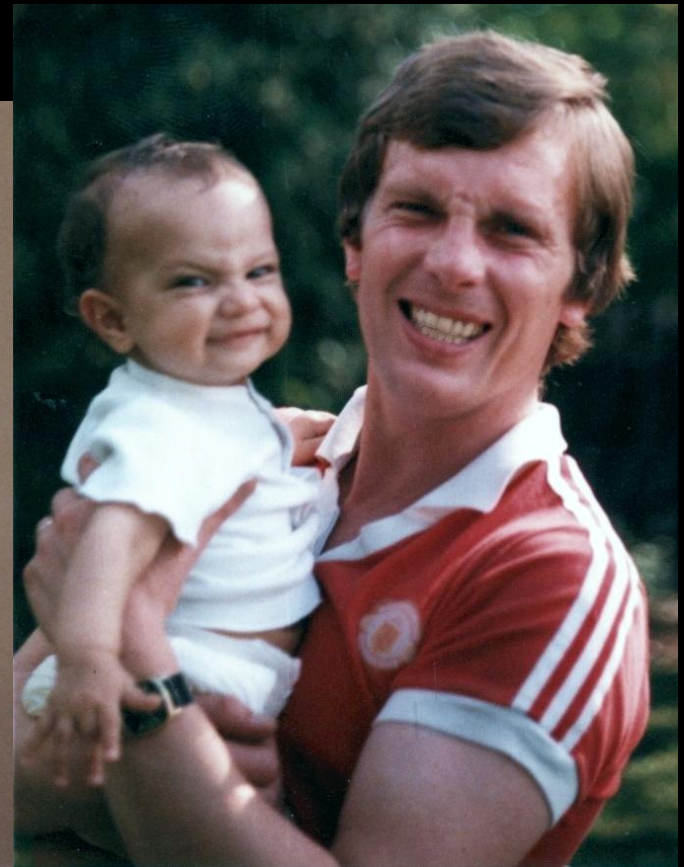
She underwent chemotherapy, followed by surgery and radiation treatment at the Montreal Children's Hospital and Montreal General Hospital.

Sân responded well for a short time, but when it was evident that the drugs were not working any more, she underwent radical abdominal surgery (mid-October), followed by an intensive course of radiation treatment in early December.

On Christmas Day, 1985, doctors found that tumours had re-appeared in her legs, jaw and elsewhere. Sîan underwent radiation treatment again, and since the regular chemotherapy “protocol” did not work, she was treated with experimental drugs.

They did not work, either, and on March 15th, 1986 Sîan passed away. She was 17 months old.

The Sîan Bradwell Fund

For Children With Cancer



- was started in 1986 at the Montreal Children's Hospital, shortly after Sîan's death, but was established formally on October 3rd, 1990 – the sixth anniversary of her birth.





The principle aims are:

- *To raise awareness of childhood cancer. Most people think of cancer as an adult disease, but children as young as 2 months old have been diagnosed.*
- *To bring together people of all ages, and give parents a chance to teach their children about compassion for other children, especially those whose school and family lives are interrupted by frequent stays in hospital due to cancer.*
- *To raise funds for priority medical equipment for early diagnosis and treatment of children with this terrible disease.*



Medical equipment

The hospitals maintain a list of priority medical equipment needs.

When a new hospital is built, governments fund the necessary medical equipment. Once equipment must be replaced, however, hospitals must rely on the support of the community.

Sîan Bradwell Fund



- *was incorporated federally in 2000 and re-certified under the new rules as a not-for-profit organisation in 2014.*
- *has an Advisory Board, all of whom are long-term volunteers.*
- *is run entirely by volunteers, whose only payment is the personal satisfaction of knowing that they are making a difference to children – some only a few months old – who are fighting for their very lives.*
- *has raised and donated over \$1,800,000 to the hospitals since 1986.*
- *Through the hospitals, provides income tax receipts for all monetary donations, 100% of which go to medical equipment.*
- *has set up endowment funds in Montreal, Toronto, Hamilton, Winnipeg, and London so that we can continue to provide support for young cancer patients in perpetuity.*

Sources of funds:



- *Donations collected year-round*
- *Sports events (softball , basketball , golf tournaments)*
- *Refreshment sales at events*
- *Sale of advertising space in souvenir books*
- *Auction of sports memorabilia*
- *Prizes draw or auction of items donated by our gracious sponsors*
- *Trivia quiz nights*
- *Family bowling days*
- *Other events organised by volunteers (e.g. Tango Rave evening, Live Band backyard party, jeans and clothing sales, school plays, sale of sheets and pillows, celebrity bartending, etc.)*

Sîan Bradwell Softball Tournament

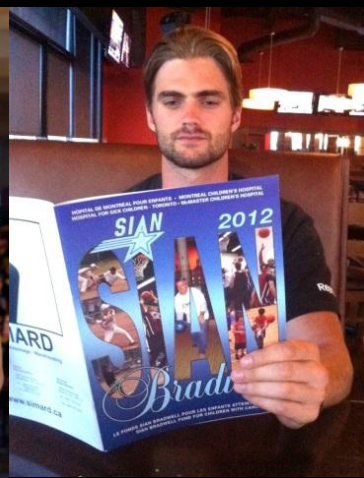

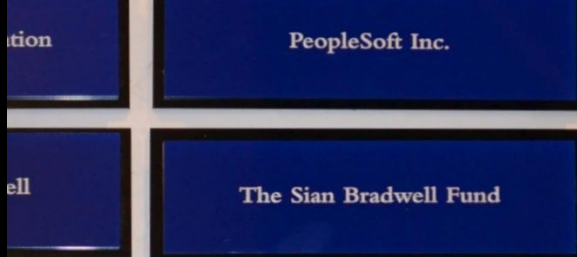

SEPTEMBER **IS CHILDHOOD CANCER** **AWARENESS MONTH**



In recognition of the fact that 400,000+ children and adolescents around the world are diagnosed with cancer each year*, September has been designated as the month for raising awareness of childhood cancer and funds for treatment and research. Sîan Bradwell Endowment Fund (SBEF)



In 2007, the Board of Directors – recognising that there will come a time when it might not be possible to find enough volunteers to run fundraising events -- voted to establish an endowment fund at the Montreal Children's Hospital, so that the Hospital could have a steady stream of income to support the Oncology department in perpetuity.

The Sîan Bradwell Endowment Fund for Sick Kids Hospital in Toronto followed in 2012, then the SBEF in Hamilton in 2014, one in Winnipeg in 2023 and one in London in 2025.

Where do the funds go?



Funds raised go towards purchasing medical equipment for diagnosis and treatment. Items purchased in the past include:

- *Alphamaquet operating tables* *Cost: \$50,000 each*
- *Ultrasonic aspirator (Cavitron)* *Cost: \$135,000*
- *Physiological monitors* *Cost: \$25,000 each*
- *Pain control medication pumps* *Cost: \$5,000 each*
- *Intravenous infusion pumps* *Cost: \$5,000 each*
- *Cell counter* *Cost: \$115,000*
- *Haematology Cytospin Centrifuge* *Cost: \$13,000*
- *Microwave tissue processor* *Cost: \$40,000*
- *Wheelchairs, wigs, gel mattresses, infant and teen weighing scales, etc.*

Infant weighing scale

Cost (1986): \$1,500



The weight of each infant must be measured very accurately in order to administer the proper chemotherapy dosages. As a result, weighing scales and other medical equipment must be manufactured to a high degree of precision, with corresponding high price.

Diagnostic microscope for Pathology

Cost (2020): \$55,000



This diagnostic microscope was requested by the Oncology department to help Pathology doctors perform a more accurate diagnosis of tissue cells.



Pathologists make the final diagnosis of whether or not a child has cancer through examining tissue cells. They then advise the Oncology doctors about what type of cancer it may be and the kind of treatment to which the cancer may respond.

Alphamaquet operating tables for Neurology

Cost (2007): \$100,000 for 2 tables



The Neurology Department uses this special operating table to treat children with brain tumours, as well as children with other neurological problems.
